

**Paces School Sports Premium**

**Academic Year:** 2020-21

**Sports Premium Strategy Funding Received:** £16,220 + (brought forward from previous year £9,235)

The spending of Sports Premium this year has been heavily impacted on the restrictions placed upon schools due to Covid 19. We were unable to welcome professionals into school to work with the pupils and were unable to facilitate visits to engage in sporting activities until the very end of the school year. The funding was used to enhance our inhouse physical provision.
