



Paces School Sports Premium

Academic Year: 2022-2023

Sports Premium Strategy Funding Received: £20,824

The spending of Sports Premium this year has been heavily impacted by our move to a new school. The move to Thorncliffe Hall has meant that we have not been able to access swimming provision as previously anticipated. At the start of the academic year £7,722 was allocated to provide swimming sessions for the pupil and in real terms only £1,188 of this was used during the first half term. The pool then became inaccessible due to the reduction in temperature of the water as well as the increase in distance from our new building to the sports centre. The reallocation of funds has been shown below.
